# **Pastoral Reflections**

# Habitat Builds!

I am so proud of NDBC's investment in Habitat for Humanity. We have done at least twenty- five Habitat "Builds," and we are celebrating that good news this month!

One month after I arrived at NDBC, back in 1997, Lisa Sealock and I went to the Day Foundation. We asked for matching grant money to partner with New Hope AME Church on a Habitat build. Lisa told me about the importance of Habitat to NDBC. She told me about some of the church's painful disagreements in the early 1990's. But she also said that folk found common ground by doing a Habitat build together. It helped the church heal. And, by the way, the Day Foundation gave us the grant!

In 1998, I went with a pile of Northside Drivers to Americus, GA, for a week-long Habitat Camp that wiped-out sub-standard housing for a whole county. Don Hall, his grandson, and I roomed together the whole week.

I remember, more than once, Bob Haywood would show up on "roofing day" for our local Habitat builds. It would be 100 degrees. The roof top was twenty-five feet off the ground. And Bob would be on top of the roof. He was 80 years old! I think Dave Wooten's prayers kept Bob from falling; or, maybe Bob was as sure-footed as a mountain goat. Goat...get it?

Theologian Emil Brunner said, "The church exists by mission, like a fire exists by burning." Amen, I say. The passion and action of mission, feeds the needs and hunger of the recipients... but they also fuel the church.

This is why I say, "Habitat Builds." It not only has built houses...it has built up NDBC as we built houses.

Congratulations Northside Drive Baptist! You've built alongside Buddhists and Bhais. You've put up molding beside Methodists and Mormons. Our sweat has mingled with the sweat equity of every homeowner -- driving nails, painting walls, and roofing roofs. Wow. We thrive at twenty-five. Habitat builds. You bet it does.




