# **Pastoral Reflections**

### "Praise Band? Sure...As Long as There Is a Lament Choir"

Praise Bands are big deals these days. Many churches use them. There are a lot of reasons why: cheaper cost, an avoidance of church music politics, and they are always upbeat. Yes, sometimes you've just got to clap your hands, raise your arms, and dance.

I think the biblical psalmists would have endorsed praise bands; but, they would have done so with a caveat. "Clap your hands you people, clap your hands, shout to God with loud songs of joy (Psalm 47), they would say. "However, alongside the praise band, you must also have a lament choir."

Read the Psalms. At least half of them contain laments. That percentage makes sense and matches life experience.

There's a lot of good in life to praise God for. But, life is not all good. Children die. Innocent are shot. Earthquakes upturn. Cancer returns. Floods drown. Depression happens. The Earth is abused, along with people. Grief is real.

Per the psalmists, all of this...all of life...is grist for the mill of worship. In fact, without the pain alongside the praise, then worship is like icing on a balloon. Happy, but hollow.

Full-bodied worship is what the biblical writers were after. Not just a cerebral cogitation on theology. Not just euphoria that gets us in a happy mood. They insisted on wholehearted worship that names heartbreaking grief, as well as heartwarming gratitude.

This past Sunday, we lamented. The cumulative effect of the week's griefs begged to be prayed: from the cries of thirsty Puerto Rico, to the bloody smell of smoking guns in Las Vegas, to the fears felt in the heart of each family.

Our Sanctuary Choir helped us lament. Their repetitive plea to God, between antiphonal prayers, named our pain.

Like the poet, Robert Bly used to say, "If Abraham Lincoln had been president during the Vietnam War, he would have gotten on TV and moaned: 'Ahhhhhhhhhhh!'"

Along with crying-out, I mentioned *Outcry.* It is a Trinity Presbyterian based, interfaith group committed to making communities safe from gun violence. Check us out: *outcrygeorgia.org*.

On Sunday, we followed the psalmists' advice. We brought our grief to God; yet, with lumps in our throats we sang our gratitude, too. By worship's end, the choir had led us from lamentation to celebration. We walked-out singing...

Thus, evermore shall rise to thee glad **hymns of praise** from land and sea.

And all God's people said, "Amen."


