Pastoral Reflections By Rev. Daniel Headrick

"A Journey of Renewal"



It seems like we just finished Advent, and Lent is already upon us! Lent officially begins on Ash Wednesday, which falls on February 14th--Valentine's Day. On Wednesday the NDBC Chapel will be open from 7:30AM to 6:30 PM for the imposition of ashes. Ashes are a reminder of our mortality, and a tangible sign that we are under the sign of the Cross. To see the universe as having a cruciform shape is to see both the presence of suffering in the world and the possibility of redemption. If we only had the Cross without Resurrection, our spiritual lives would be dreary indeed.

But the imposition of the ashes is not an invitation into gloomy melancholy. We do not pretend that Jesus is in the grave until Easter morning because we know how the story ends. Etymology is sometimes revelatory. According to Merriam-Webster, "Lent" is from the "Middle English lente springtime, Lent, from Old English lencten; akin to Old High German *lenzin* spring." Lent, then, can be understood as a time of renewal, just as spring is a fecund metaphor for renewal.

We could use many metaphors for Lent, but I like the idea of being on a journey of renewal. It is a journey to the Cross. During Lent we will liturgically reenact Jesus' journey to the Cross, his suffering and death, culminating in his glorious resurrection on Easter morning. Our path to the cruciform shape of the Universe is in an invitation to immerse ourselves in the disciplines of the Christian life so that we might draw close to God.

Many like to read devotionals, attending to the life of the mind and the matters of the heart. Last year I read Walter Brueggemann's A Way Other Than Our Own, a daily Lenten devotional. I commend it to you; it's just a few bucks in the e-book format. This year the homily series during the Lenten Thursday evening services will focus on concrete disciplines. The disciplines highlighted in our homilies will be solitude, prayer, sabbath, confession, and works of love.


If Lent is a journey, we must prepare for the journey. It makes little sense to show up at the airport without your suitcase or photo ID. Many engage in practices of fasting, where the emphasis is "what shall I give up for Lent?" Others construe Lenten practice as the adoption of positive practices. For example, you might devote yourself to regular prayer, or to acts of charity.

Understood as a journey of renewal, we may face each cross we encounter with the hope that the suffering of life leads to divine renewal. With God's help, and in God's good time, may that happen for each of you.
