Pastoral Reflection My Brush with Greatness By: James Lamkin

At the September 30th NDBC Anniversary Luncheon, we will watch a 2002 video interview with President Jimmy Carter.

He served as an NDBC deacon and Sunday School teacher, 1971—1975. Of course, at that time, he was *only* the governor. His momma told him, "When you move, join the Baptist church nearest your kitchen stove." He did. On a hot July day sixteen years ago, Syd Janney, Cheryl Dewell, Ken Brant, David Bell, and a few more, traveled to the Carter Center for the interview.

I had to submit the questions well in advance; and, then was called twice to clarify and specify. It was a big deal.

Two weeks before the interview, I was told by charter member, Rudy Brooks, that Carter had voted against building the new sanctuary (where we presently meet). Upon hearing this news, I knew I had to ask President Carter about it. But, it was too late. The questions, already, had been vetted. If I "went rogue" and veered from the script...well, the Secret Service might spring into action.

We stood in a room encircled by international flags. The multi-colors echoed the diversity of God's world and how the Carters hold it in their hearts. Since I did not want to be the sole interviewer, I invited charter member Marjorie Alberson who was 80 years old, Stuart Meeks who was 18, and Paige Whiffen who was 8, to help me. Carter seem to grin the most when Paige questioned him. His own daughter was about her age back in 1972. His eyes danced; and his gravitas grounded us all.

I asked him to reflect on his memories of NDBC. He smiled and spoke of how much the church and the people meant to him and his family. He spoke of how his kids went on *Operation Touch* Medical Mission Trips to Honduras led by Dr. Bedford Davis.

Then, he paused. After a chuckle he said, "You know I voted against that building!"

How about that? He explained that the high interest rate of the early 90's, plus the high need for hands-on missions, both weighed against it. But, he added that he had been back to NDBC since, and that the sanctuary was beautiful.

I loved watching him shake hands with Fisher Alberson whom I introduced as his unofficial campaign advisor. Fisher told of being summoned to the Governor's Mansion one day.

Carter walked with him to the rose garden and said, "Fisher, I'm thinking about running for President."

"Now," said Carter. "What do you think?" "I think you will lose," said Fisher!

When President Carter left the room, we all took a deep, gratifying breath. We were thankful witnesses of an hour like none other. President Carter's equity always has been great, in my opinion. His integrity + initiative + faith in God has continued to grow ever since.

I was honored to share this NDBC hingemoment in time. For me, it was a brush with greatness.
