Pastoral Reflections "You Can See Easter from Here" By James Lamkin

I remember the cold window pane pressed against the tip of my nose. I remember my fingertips under my chin and the condensation on the glass made by my warm breath. I remember the posture of childlike anticipation. When something or someone important to you is soon to arrive, we can't help but practice the posture of anticipation.

You've heard me tell tales of waiting for Aunt Dorcas. Christmas could not show-up until she did.

And now, this week, we approach the fourth Sunday in Lent. We stand on tiptoe. We live into the day's name. It is *Laetare Sunday*. It means rejoice.

Instinctively, I want to rush to the window, stand on a stepstool, climb onto someone's shoulders, and look beyond the plodding penitence of Lent. I look long and longingly beyond the lengthening shadows of spring. Why? Because, I know: You can see Easter from here.


This year's *Laetare* Gospel text is about the Prodigal Son. It's from the Bible's chapter about the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin, and the Lost Son. But, you could also call them, the Found Sheep, the Found Coin, and the Found Son. You could also call the tryptic. Laetare Parties. The common denominator is rejoice! When what is lost is found, then the searching woman, the seeking shepherd, and the waiting father...all rejoice and throw a party. They want everyone to share their joy.

The parable is a Rorschach test. "Tell me what you see; and I'll tell you who you are."

The parable is an invitation, too. It bids us pause our privileged finger pointing as we segregate the worthy from the unworthy; and instead, place our hands of welcome on our lost sons and daughters and brothers and sisters. And *Laetare* works its miracle: our own hearts are healed in the doing.

Yet, for some, that joy may feel too far. Laetare seems just out of reach. But, fret not. You can see Easter from here. And more important than that, Easter can see you; and you will be found.


