

Pastoral Reflections "Touched by Taliaferro's Love" **By James Lamkin**

The title is a play on words. For years

(probably about eighteen) there has been a summer mission effort called, *Touching Taliaferro with Love*. For the last thirteen of those years, our church has been the leader.

We of NDBC do missions with a loving touch. However, the people and the place of Crawfordville, touch our hearts, as well. You could argue that we are the mission field, and the county's kids are the missionaries.

Basically, we do a four-day Vacation Bible School. (I think I still have a VBS birdhouse made of popsicle sticks, plus a laminated bookmark of Jesus and the Lord's Prayer, circa 1959.)

Theologian Emil Brunner said, "The church exists by mission, like a fire exists by burning." I agree. When we give, we receive. Mission feeds and fuels. Like our vision statement says, We believe hands-on service is crucial to our own discipleship and the mission of Christ in the world.

Taliaferro (pronounced Tah-li-ver) County, GA, ninety miles east of Atlanta, is one of the poorest areas in the state. Few jobs. No grocery store, except Dollar Tree. And one school with 157 students K-12.

However, they let us come every year and hang-out. We tell Jesus stories, memorize Bible verses, do crafts, play games, watch moral movies, eat breakfast and lunch, and have a whole lot of fun.

You haven't lived until you've watched a costumed Bible story improvised on the spot by Susan Richards, Andrea Johnson, Daniel Headrick, and Doug Ivey. (Doug is a local Disciples of Christ, Pastor.) These would-be thespians break into spontaneous song with musical pieces from Les Misérables, Fiddler on the Roof, and who could forget Willie Wonka and the Chocolate Factory. They make me cry.

This year's cast of Northside Drive characters and friends included: Barbara Atchley, Angela and Doug Ivey, Cindy Bell, Daniel Headrick, Kathy Harris, Julie Hutchings, Letty Konenkamp, Lora Hawk, "The Susans": Dew, Richards, and Harlan, Virginia Gilbert, Jeanne Harrison, Terrell Kilgore, Marie Cook, Andrea Johnson, James Lamkin, plus Jefren Cruzh, Christian Pugh, and Jamir Johnson.

As always, the Konenkamps and the Meeks saved the day by letting us stay at their lake houses; plus, Kathy Harris kindly let a few stay in her Victorian Greensboro home.

"A church exists by mission...," said Brunner. God is the ultimate ecologist. Nothing is wasted. And nothing is really ever given away. The reciprocity of God always gives it back through joy, discovery, community, and love.

This year, once again, we were *Touched by* Taliaferro's Love. Thanks for sending us.



Choir Retreat Scheduled for August 23-24

The Sanctuary Choir will start the fall season with a retreat on Friday,
